GETTING CHECKED IN






We will get our tickets at the front desk. I might have to wait for a minute if there are other families checking in at the same time.


LOOKING AT A PAINTING

- I can hold my fidget, cross my arms, or hold my hands behind my back while looking at a painting.


SEATING
